NB. You can use paper if you can't find any cloth, but this will be less effective. ➢ A 'bashing' tool (hammer, large rock). ➢ Some freshly picked plant parts (leaves and flowers – but don't forget to ask for permission). <p>With the supervision of an adult, place your plant under the cloth on a hard surface and then bash it gently with your tool until the colour starts to come out across the whole area. When you peel off the cloth, you will now have your very own plant print.
